## **GREAT WILSEY PARK- PARTIAL DISCHARGE OF CONDITIONS 7 AND 45**

On behalf of our client, Redrow Homes Ltd, please find enclosed an amended submission to address consultee comments received for conditions 7 and 45 of the outline permission (DC/15/2151/OUT).

The submission pack includes the following revised documents:

- LEMP Vf8
- BMS Vf7

These documents supersede the original submission under this reference.

## Condition 7 – LEMP

The landscape officer made the following comments on the LEMP with specific concerns relating to:

- The prescriptions do not include all the habitat and planting types.
- The work schedule is not detailed enough
- The monitoring report, which is relied on, covers a period of only 5 years. How will the management
  of the site be monitored beyond that period? And how will any issues be remediated beyond that
  period.
- The management of Great Field plantation and Southern Plantation is not dealt with in sufficient detail in this document or in the implementation strategy.

The LEMP Vf7 has been updated to take into account the Landscape and Ecology Officer's comments.

Chapters 6 to 9 of the report detail the prescriptions for management actions, including those for Great Field Plantation and Southern Plantation. The sections also include all habitat and planting types for the following areas; Green Spine/Linear Country Park, Woodland and Scrub, Hedgerows and Attenuation Features.



The work schedule detailed in chapter 10 of the report has been revised and provides a schedule of work for the first 10 years following establishment.

## Condition 45 – Biodiversity Monitoring Strategy

The Ecology and Landscape Officer has advised that in general the monitoring report is acceptable. The only additional action would be to include that a record of badger road traffic accidents should be maintained throughout the monitoring period.

The Biodiversity Monitoring Strategy reference Vf7, has been updated to include maintaining a record of badger road traffic incidents throughout the monitoring period as requested by the Landscape and Ecology Officer.

I trust the enclosed is sufficient to discharge the above conditions, however, should you require any further information, please do not hesitate to contact me.
