Also the traffic congestion in Haverhill is becoming worse .

Haverhill has suffered closure of a fantasic health facility the crown centre with thousands of new residents our now poor doctor surgeries over crowed are buckling and cannot cope with the population now and no signs of this improving any time soon.we have to travel over an hour by bus to hospital's. Employment we have lost jobs with more to come as Sonofi reduce 45 posts and will be making more redundant in 2016 .the jobs to be created by this new build will a be a few mostly part time for child care .

I have conveyed my concerns fully in the past and spoken to others who also agree it is a depressing worry that St Edmundsbury council seem to only want to meet government proposals for more new homes but it is far too many 200 maybe yours sincerely
