Our concerns about the Great Wilsey Park development:

- 1. It is <u>essential</u> that the approved relief road is built to avoid congestion in Chalkstone Way, where there are <u>3 schools</u> and the New Croft facility. Chalkstone Way, Millfields Way and Manor Road all exit via T-junctions onto busy main roads where there is already congestion.
- Without the approved relief road the queue for Cangle Junction, from the A143, Wratting Road, will be a worse bottle neck. Also, the A1307 road towards Cambridge will be even more congested.
- 3. Drivers from the new estate would be likely to use the Chalkstone Way exit to access the A1017 by-pass; with resulting congestion in the minor roads already mentioned.
- 4. It is essential that the wood behind the Wilsey and Roman estates is kept as a natural screen between the new and old estates. It is already valued and will reduce the disruption [e.g. caused by building dust and noise] to existing homes. When the new estate is built the green space will prevent the merging of all the estates on the north east of the town becoming <u>one</u> mega estate.
