> How it will affect the surrounding area - for us we are concerned that the land gifted to Samuel ward will be subject to unregulated development. For example, when the Churchill school was erected, a green belt of trees was demolished leaving full view of the school, which was not in keeping with the landscape (pink/purple exterior painting) plus the aggravated effect of security lighting which impacts directly on our outlook. So, the development will affect our enjoyment even more.

> The whole of the north side of the town will lose what is currently open woodland and meadows.

> Further to this, we are aware that business is slow in coming to the town as evidenced by the recently developed Haverhill Business Park which still remains empty; this implies that Haverhill will continue to be a dormitory town for Cambridge and Bury st.

> It would seem to us that the infrastructure outside of Haverhill, e.g. the A1307 has never been improved to cope with growth and at the very least the Linton Bypass should be considered if the current residents of the town are not to spend even more time on their daily commute.

> If the town is going to expand by 2500 extra houses this would suggest around a further 10000 people in the town with little or no improvement to public transport.
