With regard to the Persimmon development off Anne Sucking Road, we would add our objections to the opening up of this Road to the Persimmon estate traffic. We were promised some years ago that this would not happen and there would be a bus gate at the end of the road with rising bollards and it was not for general traffic, this road would meet up with Howe Road and was for buses and emergency vehicles only. ANNE Sucking Road is the only way out for the residents of the Boyton Hall estate, to allow the Road to be opened up to the Persimmon estate would make life unbearable to us and our neighbours who back on to this Road, with all the noise and pollution from the increased traffic. Turning out of Anne Sucking Road onto Wrattling Road is very dangerous and difficult as the traffic is increasing every day, traffic lights would result in a queue of traffic and all the pollution resulting from cars.
