A road to 1,150 homes in Haverhill is being branded dangerous before it's even built

Now, 4 years later, 4th October 2021, Persimmon have submitted yet further plans to link Ann Suckling Road to the new development. Persimmon are not listening, in fact no body seems to be listening, & don't care what Boyton Hall residents feel. We live in Boyton Close, going out onto Ann Suckling Road is not a good experience because of parked cars close to the turning from Wratting Road. If the volume of traffic increases much more, that is without a new road, there will be a serious accident along Ann Suckling Road. We have lived at Boyton Close for 39 years and we are clearly upset by all the excessive building that is going on in our area. We were advised 10years ago that Ann Suckling Road would not be a through road. Persimmon home are supposed to be building a bypass. Surely this should have been done first to take heavy traffic from Boyton Hall Estate. In fact the by pass should now be Persimmon Home's Priority not the new houses.

This report is dated 25 May 2017 , and I quote "An access road for a 1,150-home development proposed near Haverhill has again met with objections because it is deemed too dangerous. Persimmons Homes' vast project to the north-west of town would take cars straight out onto Ann Suckling Road in Little Wratting, but [Haverhill town councillors](#) objected to this plan over safety concerns. Now, 4 years later, Persimmon have submitted yet further plans to link Ann Suckling Road to the new development, despite these previous objections. Yet again, we must voice our objections to this proposal and remind our local Town Council that traffic flows have only increased with time and we still do not have the Northern Relief Road. This is an issue for everybody on the Boyton Hall estate. The Council will only contact those who have commented or live in the near vicinity of any development. Some people on our estate are still not aware of the implications of this development. A petition has been going around the estate and hopefully you are all signed up to it. Additionally, we still need to object formally to West Suffolk. We have produced a poster which

is attached to this email. We would encourage people to display in their windows to highlight this issue and make everybody aware. Please, no more "I didn't know". We have also attached a QR code for registering an objection on the West Suffolk Portal. Just scan and it will take you straight there. You will need to register, but it does help to keep you informed of future issues.
