Good Morning.

**This is an objection to plans by Persimmon to use Anne Suckling Road as an access road to the estate they are building.**

Back in 2017 the local council objected to Anne Suckling Road being used as an access road to be dangerous.

The road is far from suitable to carry any more traffic than it is now, with the development of more housing along this road there will be an increase in traffic and very likely more parking, parking is a concern now where the road comes off the A143, cars parked adjacent new build Persimmon homes and double parked at times, means an accident waiting to happen, much more traffic and this will be a serious problem. Access to the A143 from Anne Suckling Road is not a good junction to come out from, on the brow of the hill, again more traffic here and probably heavy trucks taking a shortcut will no doubt cause accidents.

I have to ask the question why Persimmon wants to take the road through to their estate when there is to be a bypass road going in, with roundabouts which would be far safer than using Anne Suckling Road.

It's really hard to believe this has reached any planning stage, it just can't go ahead.
