Comment: Is there still an Ann(e) Sucklings Lane? Is this off Ann Sucklings Road?

My concerns were raised initially by the number of properties notified on this further update.

Some joker peeled off the 38 label from the sign off Ann Sucklings Road that was stuck over the original 17 houses and re-stuck it to read 138. Was he/she right all along?

Many years past when these plans were mooted, we objected, as parking for children's cars runaway from the allotted number. We have a four car drive and try to use it for ours and visitors but getting in and out of Cross Close is a very cautious affair due to many three and four car households taking up the street parking. We objected on the grounds that Ann Sucklings Road would become a car park. To prove the point, it already has at the road entrance following construction of the houses off Wratting Road.

As more houses become occupied on the developments the traffic situation will worsen with the likelihood of RTAs becoming regular after we return to normal from covid-19 lockdowns.

If construction is to be allowed, then yellow lines to prevent parking must be installed /extended

along Ann Sucklings Road.
