Things became worse when the flats were built on the corner of the road further up the hill.

The traffic using this road is horrendous especially at school times and rush hours.

We have to put up with huge HGV's which for some reason use the road as a cut through from somewhere, Car transporters use it loaded with cars, all just about make it through until they reach Withersfield Road then they have to mount the pavement to turn right. We have had our wing mirrors knocked off twice.

If anymore residences are built on Crowland Road things can only get worse.

This should become a one way street which would maybe solve the traffic and parking problems or at least some width restrictions to stop the HGV's and those that use it as a race track.

If another block of flats which is probably the intention is built Crowland Road will become unbearable for parking and living as the traffic starts around six in the morning and is very noisy.

The traffic wardens make a point of coming at about 10 every Sunday without fail and manage to book someone, you can even park in Central London on a yellow line on Sunday for free.

We all hope this application is refused and some consideration taken to make Crowland Road a one way street.
