TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

CONSULTATION RETURN: DC/25/1620/FUL

PROPOSAL: Planning application - one commercial building (class E) with associated works

LOCATION: Land Off Homefield Road Haverhill Suffolk

Suffolk County Council, as Lead Local Flood Authority (LLFA), is a statutory consultee under the Town and Country Planning Act for major applications and some minor applications where flooding has been identified.

Due to the development being less than one hectare and the likelihood of a surface water flood event occurring is very low. The proposal is unlikely to cause any significant intensification of surface water runoff, and therefore we have no comment to make, and we would point the LPA and the applicant towards the following guidance:-

- Any works to a watercourse may require consent under section 23 of the Land Drainage Act 1991
- Any discharge to a watercourse or groundwater needs to comply with the Water Environment (Water Framework Directive) (England and Wales) Regulations 2017
- Any discharge of surface water to a watercourse that drains into an Internal Drainage Board district catchment is subject to payment of a surface water developer contribution
- Any works to lay new surface water drainage pipes underneath the public highway will need a licence under section 50 of the New Roads and Street Works Act
- Any works to a main river may require an environmental permit
