I am writing on behalf of the SAVE campaign, with just a few weeks remaining before the 25th September deadline to object to the proposed Grange Farm development. As you can see, we are asking all local Parish Council's for their further interest and support to help ensure that local people's voices are heard before it is too late. Of course, we are particularly keen to gain support from Haverhill, and to understand your point of view. To this end, would you help us to arrange a meeting between representatives of the SAVE campaign and David Stinchcombe?

South Cambridgeshire District Council is proposing to build a new town of at least 4,500 homes along with commercial units, shops and offices on farmland opposite the villages of Great and Little Abington, and

alongside the A1307. This town will be seen by all of us – located on one of the highest elevations in south Cambridgeshire. It will threaten the local water supply for most of us, and is expected to add to the congestion of all key road routes, including the A11 and M11. For more information, see www.s-a-v-e.co.uk

The Regulation 19 consultation, which runs from 3 August to 25 September, represents the final opportunity for residents, organisations and parish councils to submit comments and objections before the Local Plan is finalised and submitted to central government in December.

That is why the support of your Parish Council is so important. By encouraging residents to take part in the consultation and by making your own representations, you can help ensure that local concerns are fully heard before the deadline.

We would be hugely grateful for any and all support you can give the SAVE campaign in helping to protect this area and ensure the community's voice is heard while there is still time.

Please could you let us know what your Parish Council wants to do next to support the SAVE campaign?

1. Confirm your support – Let us know whether your Parish Council supports the SAVE campaign. Please let us know, even if you do not support the campaign.

2. Endorse the campaign – Provide a letter or statement of support that we can include in our campaign materials.

3. Help fund our campaign – If you haven't done so already, consider making a donation to our campaign's legal fund. Simply press the 'donate now' button on the front page of our website: www.s-a-v-e.co.uk Please let us know as well.

4. Promote the campaign locally – Share information with parishioners about how they can make personal donations to the SAVE campaign, using the same method.

5. Encourage local residents to act – Help us spread the word and encourage parishioners to submit comments and objections to the proposed Grange Farm development during the Regulation 19 consultation. Even if they have objected previously, it is important to comment again, as representations made at this stage carry greater weight.
