There must be many, more appropriate places to position this Digester and all the extra HGV movements not only on the Haverhill-Cambridge road but all the HGV movements through the villages.

Already the Thurlow Estate have their grain transported by lorries that are used on inappropriate roads such as the Withersfield (Silver Street) to Cambridge Road. During these periods their braking skid marks are all over the road as they are too big/wide.

A good number of years ago a restriction sign on this road was erected BUT I assume the Estate used its influence to over-ride this safety discussion because of convenience.

The roads are just not wide enough to accommodate these vehicles SAFELY.
