Secondly the added traffic to what is already an extremely busy road is another major issue. The entrance for our customers is directly opposite the proposed entrance for the HGVs/ Tractors to enter the plant.

I also have concerns over the fact that the land in question lies within the green belt. Which to my knowledge is somewhere not to build on. To add to this I have noticed numerous times over the years, of the site severely flooding. Surely an area that floods is an extremely dangerous place to be building a site of this scale.

The thought of this proposal is extremely concerning to me on a personal and professional level, like many small businesses such as mine, trying to recover after the Covid 19 pandemic has been a real challenge. Now with this development being put forward I am deeply concerned of what this might entail for me.
