**Subject:** Construction of an anaerobic digestion facility outskirts of Haverhill Suffolk.

This proposed construction is not in the right location because:

Creating very bad smells as our town is situated in a valley and the wind mainly comes from the west. This area of town is very highly populated.

This will be built on a flood plain and in the case of a spillage will contaminate the existing flood park and stream that runs through the centre of Haverhill.

The entrance to the plant will be off the A317 which is already very congested and this will inevitably cause accidents.

I understand there will be a pipeline for waste product running to West Wratting airfield, if this is the case then surely it would be more sensible to put this plant in that location as it would be considerably higher and a lot more remote.

My wife and myself visit Lincoln frequently and on the way we pass two similar plants which create horrendous smells which can be smelt at least two miles from them.

We have lived in Haverhill for over 70 years and we do not think our town deserves this unnecessary aggravation.
